

DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

Day one: Arrive Windhoek International Airport for your shared light aircraft flight to Sossusvlei where you are met by the camp guide and transferred to the lodge. **Day two & three**: Start off your day with an early morning game drive to the impressive Sossusvlei dunes. Visit Deadvlei, a white clay pan characterized by pitch black Camel Thorn trees contrasted against the bleach white pan floor which make for spectacular photo's. Spend the remainder of your time enjoying bush walks, quadbike excursions or stargazing on the private reserve. An optional extra is an early morning hot air balloon trip soaring high above the magnificent sand dunes.

Day four: Transfer to the airstrip for your shared light aircraft flight to the Skeleton Coast. You will be met by the camp guide and vehicle and transferred to the property. **Day five & six:** There are so many different options to fill your days; enjoy an excursion to Mowe Bay seal colony, visit the remnants of the Suiderkus Shipwreck and pass by abandoned diamond mines and spend time at the Flamingo pools. Take a 4x4 trip to the Clay Castles and keep an eye out for the elusive Brown Hyena's. Also be on the lookout for desert adapted elephants and lions. Other experiences are sundowner drives to the roaring dunes, guad bike excursions and sumptuous beach lunches.

Day seven: Transfer to the airstrip for your shared light aircraft flight to Hoanib Valley. You will be met by the camp vehicle and transferred to the property.

Day eight & nine: At this remote destination, you can look forward to meeting with the local communities and spend some time with the Himba and Herero people to understand their unique cultures. The Himbas are one of the last true nomadic tribes of Africa. Explore the rugged area on game drives and learn more about the giraffe research that is conducted in this isolated area.

Day ten: Transfer to the airstrip for your shared light aircraft flight to Etosha. You will have a short game drive into camp on arrival.

Day eleven: The day is at leisure to enjoy the camp activities. Day and night game drives, visiting hides overlooking waterholes, walks with experienced guides can all be enjoyed exclusively on the Ongava reserve. Morning game drives into the nearby Etosha National Park are also offered.

Day twelve: Transfer to the airstrip for your shared light aircraft flight to Windhoek International Airport for your flight and onward journey
