

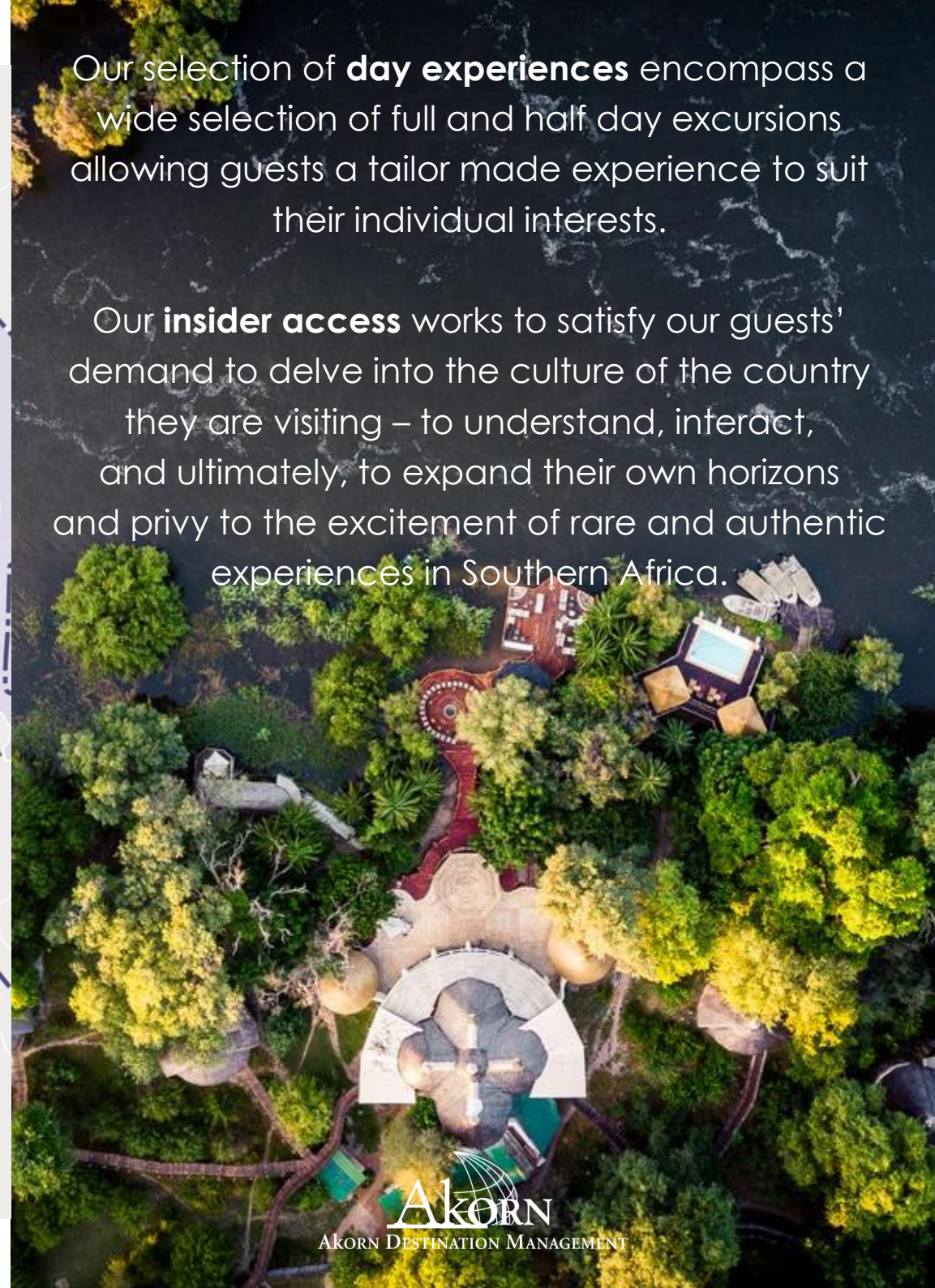

Insider Access

AKP Project – Nakatindi Village & School

Nakatindi is a community of 2800 people bordering the Mosi-oa-Tunya National Park. Visiting the community provides insights into the cultures and traditions of Southern Zambian tribe members as well as AKP programs in education, healthcare, enterprise and conservation.

Chipego Bike Shop

Rent a bike from the shop and enjoy your village tour from the comfort of your bike. This programme is a social enterprise, combining business enterprise with social good. Some of the many benefits are creating employment opportunities, empowering women, generating an income for a rural village and providing affordable mobility to a community.



Sishemo Bead Studio

Visit Sishemo Bead Studio and learn how to make beads from recycled glass bottles with a group of community members. The artisans painstakingly fire and shape each bead by hand, creating unique shapes, colours and designs. These beads are then used to make totally unique necklaces, bracelets, earrings and other products.

Enjoy an adventurous day in the famous Chobe National Park, experiencing the best of both worlds by exploring the park on both land and water.



Tour of the Falls

The Victoria Falls are a sight of awe-inspiring beauty and grandeur on the Zambezi River, bordering Zambia and Zimbabwe. A path along the edge of the forest provides the visitor an unparalleled series of views of the Falls. Enjoy an opportunity to do some curio shopping in the adjacent open-air markets before returning their hotel.



Livingstone Island Visit

Livingstone Island is located in the middle of the Zambezi River, touching the lip of the Victoria Falls. Access to the island is seasonal and depends on water levels. All visits are during the 'low water' season, which is usually from mid July to the end of January. The trip includes a short guided tour of the island, viewing the Victoria Falls and a light meal.



Sunset Cruise African Queen

The impressive African Queen, a triple deck 70 foot catamaran offer the charming combination of panoramic views of the mighty Zambezi River - taking you back to an era when time stood still. Heed the call of Africa while sipping cocktails and enjoying delicious snacks in the fading twilight hours on this fabulous sunset cruise.

Flight of Angels

The "Flight of Angels" is an amazing journey over the 1708 meter (5604 feet) vast curtain of water that is Victoria Falls and along the Zambezi River and the Zambezi National Park. Enjoy an unforgettable helicopter journey comprising of four circuits (two on either side) offering unrivalled and spectacular views and photographic opportunities while putting the full breadth and height of The Falls into perspective within the surrounding environment.





David Livingstone Museum

Established in 1934 and located in the heart of the city, the Livingstone Museum is the oldest and largest of the four national museums in the country. It holds a vast archaeological collection and the largest collection of the biodiversity of Zambia. The Museum has a rich ethnographic collection dating back to the early 20th century and a vast collection of David Livingstone memorabilia and has one of the oldest libraries in the country.



White Water Rafting

The mighty Zambezi is a river, a waterfall, and the most magnificent white water rafting corridor on earth! Victoria Falls is a mile long curtain of water that stretches across the glistening basalt rock, erupts into spray, and then thunders into the canyons below. This is the 'highway' for the exhilarating rafts.



Lunar Rainbow Tour

Lunar rainbows, also known as 'moon bows', are rainbows that take place when a rainbow is seen in the light of the full moon. Victoria Falls is one of a very limited number of sites around the world, which are known for the occurrence of moon bows. The lunar rainbow is a spectacular event that can be seen only during the full moon. The Lunar rainbow tour is conducted over a period of three days, during full moon at the Victoria Falls.



Elephant Experience

The Elephant Cafe, a tented restaurant built on a wooden deck in the Zambezi River, is a 25-minute boat ride upstream from Victoria Falls. This exclusive restaurant is the centre point of a riverside location that has been home to a herd of hand-reared elephants for many years. You will have the opportunity to meet the herd, learn their stories and enjoy a once-in-a-lifetime close encounter with these gentle giants before you are welcomed in for a unique dining experience.
