GERMANY

TIMELESS TRADITIONS

NUREMBURG CHRISTKINDLESMARKT

BERLIN


DRESDEN

ROTHENBURG OB DER TAUBER


LAKE TEGERNSEE

CHRISTKINDLMARKT AT RATHAUSPLATZ

Set against the stunning backdrop of the Rathaus, it dazzles with twinkling trees, an ice rink, and glowing decorations. When the many shopping streets and Advent markets light up the city of Vienna in the run-up to Christmas, one place shines especially brightly: the Vienna Christmas Market is considered one of Europe's most beautiful Christmas markets.

INNSBRUCK


SALZBURG


PRAGUE

OLD TOWN CHRISTMAS MARKET




Old Town to Castle: Fairytale Prague


PRAGUE CASTLE






STRASBOURG CHRISTMAS MARKET


REIMS
