

Embrace your experience further and discover the ecosystem from a helicopter ride, a backstage visit to the renowned bird park or on a rafting trip above the falls. On the other hand, the Argentine side offers a closer view. Thanks to their longer catwalks, pristine forests and the chance of setting foot on the Devil's Throat fall or the San Martin Island, you can enjoy a completely different experience of Iguassu.

AMAZONIA

Hosting more than 60% of the Amazon rainforest -including the largest protected areas-, it is no wonder Brazil is the first country that comes to mind when one thinks of the Amazon. The vast expansiveness of the world's largest forest and biggest river can truly be felt here. A unique feature of the Brazilian Amazon is seeing the meeting of the waters just outside of Manaus, where the Rio Negro and the Salomões Rivers converge, bringing to life the mythic Amazon River. PANTANAL

The world's largest tropical wetland. It is so large that it knows no borders and extends 195,000 kilometers squared through Brazil, Bolivia and Paraguay; a true wonder of Mother Nature! Besides the unique colorful fauna that is found in Pantanal, some of the species that call this place home are: capybaras, tapirs, howler monkeys and the majestic jaguar! In fact, Pantanal is considered to be the wildlife sanctuary of South America and the best place in the world to see wild Jaguars.

NORTH PANTANAL





Southern Pantanal offers a more intense natural experience, thanks to the wide array of wildlife that can be seen here. Some of the species that call this place home are: parrots, toucans, macaws, caimans, howler monkeys or giant otters, just to mention a few. Southern Pantanal floods much more than the north, which causes an increase of aquatic vegetation, which consequently means more animals to see!

North Pantanal begins 120km south of Cuiabá, the capital

city of Mato Grosso state. The region is traversed by the Transpantaneira road - a raised dirt track with over 100

wooden bridges. Those willing to make the effort to travel

to the end of the road will not only get more chances to see

wildlife along the ride, but to be rewarded with a sighting of the elusive jaguar. This is one of the few places in the world where -during the months of June to October- there are very

good chances of seeing wild jaguars in their natural habitat.



JAGUAR SUITES

Right in the heart of "Jaguarland" along the Piquiri River, the Jaguar Suites is a floating barge with high-quality hospitality experience. The eight spacious suites with full-length windows and verandas is one of the only places where you might see a jaguar from your room. Daily excursions on comfortable skiffs provide great chances to see jaguars, giant river otters, large caiman and capybaras among other regional wildlife.



CAIMÁN ECOLODGE

The best combination of wildlife and hospitality in Brazil's Southern Pantanal. Composed of three independent complexes, Caiman has one of the largest protected private reserves. The lodge offers a variety of experiences designed to appreciate the unique wildlife of the region. Don't miss the opportunity to accompany a biologist from the Onçafari program monitoring the various jaguars on the property.






The driest season in Campo Grande is from June through August. On the other hand, in Cuiabá, it's from mid-May through

SALVADOR DA BAHIA

Founded in 1549, it was Brazil's first capital, and currently one of our most important cities, which truly represents the soul of Brazil. It's no wonder the historic center of the city, known as Pelourinho has been recognized as an UNESCO cultural heritage site. CAPOEIRA CLASS EXPERIENCE

Considered an important part of Brazilian cultural heritage, Capoeira is an Afro-Brazilian martial art that combines dance, acrobatics and music. This national park preserves vast dunes with fresh water lagoons. PRAIA DO FORTE

Praia do Forte sits in a protected area with 12 kilometers (7 miles) of semi-desertic beaches. Surrounded by lush coconut trees, this area features vivid coral reefs, whale-watching zones and beaches that -besides being beautiful- also make perfect cribs for turtle eggs.

It is also home to the headquarters of the Tamar Project, fundamental in the efforts of natural preservation of the region. The area also maintains ruins of the only medieval-style building of the country, the Garcia D'Ávila Castle.

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Tivoli EcoResort Praia do Forte Bahia is set in 30,000 hectares of tropical rainforest and boasts 12 kilometers (7.5 miles) of golden beachfront. This is an excellent choice for a family holiday, thanks to its Careta Careta children's club and exclusive services for babies, toddlers, kids and teens. Couples will also find it ideal for a relaxing escape or honeymoon, due to the beaches, activities and experiences available. The variety of restaurants and bars make for a culinary trip around the world.



ITACARÉ

Between Salvador and Ilheus is Itacaré, a beach town that, back in the day, served as one of the first Portuguese colonial settlements. At first, Itacaré may seem like a normal coastal town, but the deeper you walk into its history, the more you will fall in love with this place; home to unspoiled nature, delectable food, tranquility and 33km (20 mi) of whitesand beach. It is all these elements combined that make this destination such a perfect place for those in search of a break.



TXAI ITACARÉ RESORT

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A fantastic getaway in the Atlantic Rainforest along the coast of southern Bahia. From here guests can visit a local cacao farm to learn where chocolate comes from or learn about Txai's sea turtle protection program.



TRANCOSO

Just 30 km (18.5 mi) from Puerto Seguro Airport, framed by cotton-like white sand, hills, cliffs and coconut palms, sits Trancoso. What makes it special is the small village around the square, adorned with a small church and bright colonial homes. Time moves slower here. It's no wonder some celebrities have it for their beach homes.






TEMPERATURE CHART FOR RIO DE JANEIRO




TEMPERATURE CHART FOR IGUASSU




TEMPERATURE CHART FOR THE AMAZON




TEMPERATURE CHART FOR SALVADOR DA BAHIA




TEMPERATURE CHART FOR PANTANAL (CAMPO GRANDE)
